Open to members only. Entrance Fee £4.00

Except for Scratch, Veterans and Octogenarians Competitions a minimum of 10 entries are required for all board competitions to be valid.

COMPETITION STARTING SHEETS

Competition starting sheets are available on the screen in the foyer from 7 a.m. two weeks before the competition and online from the following Monday. During the first week **ONLY COMPETITORS** may book a starting time. In the second week the free times are open to non competitors.

Please remove your name from the BRS system if you are unable to play in a competition. The Greens Committee will consider suspending from competitions members who do not attend for their starting times.

INVITATION DAY

The Invitation Day sheets will be displayed in the clubhouse at 7:30pm on the following dates;

Men's Invitation Day	Wednesday 3rd April
Autumn Invitation Day	Wednesday 17th July

when starting times can be booked and entrance fee paid.

NOTE bookings must be made in person and members are only allowed their own couples starting time.

MATCH PLAY COMPETITIONS

In Match Play competitions the draw will be posted in the club house. Competitors will play on current handicap. Strokes will equate to full handicap difference. All matches including finals to be played over 18 holes. **ONLY IN EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES WILL EXTENSIONS OF THE TIME BE GRANTED.**

Written application must be made to the Greens Committee.

The onus is placed equally on both parties to make arrangements to play the match. Players are asked to put their phone numbers on the draw sheet as soon as possible but this will not be seen as an attempt to arrange the match. If no arrangements have been made to play the match it will take place at 4pm on the closing date for that round. The chairman of the Greens Committee, the Match Secretary and the Captain will determine any disputes.

DECISION ON A TIE MATCH PLAY

In the event of a tie after 18 holes, the next three holes **MUST** be played under handicap: if the match is still undecided, the first hole to be won under handicap after 21 holes played will decide the match.

MEDAL PLAY

In the event of a tie in all medal competitions, the result will be decided on the last 18 holes of a 36 hole competition; or the last 9 holes for an 18 hole competition. If still a tie, the result of the last 9,6,3, or last 12 holes will be the deciding factor.

STROYAN MEDAL

18 Holes Stableford Competition.

Winner qualifies for Searson Cup.

STROYAN CUP

18 Holes Medal, qualifying round. Best 8 nett cards qualify for Match Play Competition.

SEARSON CUP

18 Holes Medal open to 3 competitors from each division of the following Medal Competitions which qualify:- 1 Best Nett Card. 2 Second Best Nett Card. 3 Best Gross other than 1 or 2.

All Medals, Silkstone Cup, Stroyan Medal (winner only).

Les and David Richardson Qualifying round, Vice-Captains Prize Qualifying Round, Stroyan Cup Qualifying Round, Speeds Trophy, Second Division Cup, Scratch Cup & Scratch Medals (winner only), Oakes Cup, Handbury Trophy, Centenary Salver.(Played off full handicap)

JUNIOR MEMBERS

Junior Members with an official handicap may play in all competitions provided that the marker is over 18 years of age.

ETIQUETTE OF GOLF

1. Divots on all parts of the Course must be replaced and pitch marks on greens repaired. Please advise members of your group if they fail to do this.
2. No one should move or talk or stand close to or directly behind the ball or the hole when a player is making a stroke.
3. The player who has the honour should be allowed to play before his/her opponent tees his ball.
4. No player should play until the party in front are out of range.
5. When the result of a hole has been determined, players must leave the putting green before marking their score card.
6. Players, while looking for a lost ball, should allow other matches coming up to pass them; They should signal to the players following them to pass and having given such a signal, they should not continue their play until these players have passed and are out of range.
7. Players should carefully fill up all holes made in a bunker.
8. Players should not damage the holes on the greens by standing close to them at any time.
9. A player who has incurred a penalty should intimate the fact to his opponent as soon as possible.
10. Players should at all times play without undue delay. If a match fails to keep its place on the course and loses more than one clear hole on the players in front it must invite the match following to pass through.
11. Caddy cars should not be taken over greens or tees.
12. A player should not stand on or walk over tees being rested.
13. It is accepted courtesy at ALFRETON G.C. to offer the Captain the honour of the 1st Tee as well as due consideration elsewhere on the course.
14. The Rules of Golf provide for a player to be disciplined for a breach of etiquette and, if the case is sufficiently serious, disqualified from a competition.

Examples of breaches which may cause disciplinary action or disqualification:-

Not inviting the group behind to play through in the event of losing a hole on the green in front.

Failure to rake bunkers, mend pitch marks, repair divots.

Taking a divot on a practice swing or otherwise causing unnecessary damage.

Playing before the players in front are out of range.

Endangering Greens Staff.

Causing distraction to an opponent or fellow competitor.

15. Competition Winners are expected to attend all presentations.

NOTE: Do not cause potential embarrassment by requiring the Captain or any other official/committee member to remind you of the above rules.

HEALTH AND SAFETY

Members, Visitors and Staff must adhere to the health and safety policy of Alfreton Golf Club as posted in the clubhouse. If you are in any doubt or require a copy of this document please contact the Secretary. It is the legal obligation of everyone to take good care and exercise responsibility at all times whilst at Alfreton Golf Club.

Health and Safety issues must be reported to the Secretary or the Chairman of the Greens Committee

COURSE RULES

1. All players must have adequate insurance against damage to persons and property.
2. Matches and Club Competitions have priority on the Course over casual golfers.
3. All Club Competitions to commence from the first tee, except when otherwise authorised by the Greens Committee
4. Except in competitions with starting times, matches on the first tee shall alternate with those playing a full round leaving the 11th green.
5. In competitions, groups playing the 17th hole must let those playing the front nine through. This may mean letting more than one group through. In casual play alternate.
6. When stroke play competitions are in progress at weekends only those with starting times may play the course before 4pm. After 4pm a starting time is not required.
7. Except where stated all men's Club Competitions to be played from white tees, 'Social golf, by Ladies and Men, may be played from white, yellow/blue or red tees, except on the sixth hole where Men must play from the yellow tee'.
8. Juniors with a Club handicap may play in all competitions. Their card must be signed by an adult member.
9. Only those with dispensation from the Secretary may use mobile phones on the course.
10. Players must not play a shot if the greens staff are within range until receiving a signal that it is safe to do so.
11. Players must be aware that if there is any chance of someone being injured as a result of their shot, then they are expected not to play until the risk to others is past. Particular care should be taken when people are using the footpaths crossing the 5th and 8th holes, the footpath adjacent to the 5th tee and the roadway alongside the 2nd hole.
12. Players must report to the Secretary as soon as possible if a ball is hit over the boundary fence running alongside Wingfield Road or into the gardens of the cottages near the 2nd hole.
13. Except when playing in Competitions players must not play from any tee in open play. The ball must be dropped in accordance with Rule 24.2 (without penalty)
14. Practising is not allowed on the course except:
Two drives are permitted on par fours but thereafter only one ball is to be played. Under no circumstances should more than one ball be played into any green.
15. Except when winter teeing arrangements apply the first tee is closed on Saturdays between 9.00am - 11.30am and 1.30pm - 4.00pm

16. Buggies are permitted on the course for those whose medical or physical condition does not allow them to complete 18 holes subject to conditions, and to the approval of the Club Secretary. A copy of the conditions and an indemnification form can be obtained from that Officer.'
17. More than one person playing with one set of clubs is not permitted, except in accordance with the Rules of Golf.
18. Membership tags must be displayed at all times.
19. Members must adhere to the course dress code and are responsible for the dress and conduct of their guests. Men shall not wear their shirts outside their trousers or shorts.
20. Any complaints about the condition of the Course to be addressed to the Chairman of the Greens Committee or Club Secretary.
21. Distance measuring equipment may be used on the Course including competitions.
22. It is the responsibility of all golfers to use their own discretion as to whether to play in thunderstorms or fog but they should be aware that to play in such conditions may invalidate their insurance. A klaxon will sound to suspend competitions during a thunderstorm.
23. Competitions will not commence if it is not possible to see the tree to the right of the 11 green from the first medal tee and Members are advised to follow this rule in casual play.
24. When winter rules are in force, electric trolleys must have hedgehog or winter wheels. **IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT PLAYERS LIGHTEN THEIR BAGS DURING THIS PERIOD.**

JUNIOR PRACTICE EVENING

During the summer Thursday evenings, when no other competitions are arranged, will be Junior Practice Evenings. Members are requested to show due consideration.

VISITOR RULES

Visitors shall only be entitled to the reduced green fee on a maximum of ten occasions in any calendar year. Visitors shall not be introduced to the Course when starting times are in operation except with specific approval. All visitors must be signed in and green fees paid before starting play. A member wishing to sign in more than three guests at the reduced green fee must make an arrangement with the Secretary.

HOUSE RULES

1.

Dress

No one shall use the Clubhouse wearing golf shoes, training shoes or blue denim jeans. Except when specifically stated otherwise, smart casual wear is acceptable in the Clubhouse at all times. This includes clean conventional golf wear but not dirty, soiled, wet or sweaty golf clothing, waterproofs, collarless shirts or tee shirts which are not recognised golf attire, hats and clothing with large logos.

The above does not apply to Members making short term visits to the Clubhouse e.g. to enter names on to starting sheets or deliver or collect correspondence.

For interclub friendly matches including junior matches and mixed foursomes and the like, the Captain (or Captain of the Day/Organiser) will give prior direction on the need for formal or casual dress.

Formal Dress is required at Dinners such as the Men's Annual Presentation, the Ernest Goodwin Evening and the Annual Dinner/Dance.

Smart Casual wear is acceptable at social events.

A polo neck sweater or a cravat may be worn instead of a tie.

Shorts are not to be worn in the Dining Room and all shorts worn elsewhere must be properly tailored shorts recognised for golf use under the Course Dress Code.

2. Children under 16 are not allowed in the bar area unless accompanied by an adult
3. Members and social members are allowed only three visitors at any one time in the Club House. If they wish to bring more visitors, then they are to contact the Secretary first.
4. The Committees have the right to restrict general usage of the Club House at certain times, e.g. Committee Meetings.
5. Members should give adequate notice to the Clubhouse Manager when meals are required.
6. All bar prices to be fixed in consultation with the House Committee.
7. All complaints shall be addressed to the Club Secretary preferably in writing. On no account shall complaints be made to the Clubhouse Manager.
8. Please do not put the Clubhouse Manager in the embarrassing position of having to ask you to leave the Club House for any reason whatsoever.

NOTE: Please also remember the dress rules on the course.
